<p><b>Note 1:</b> A student placed in DAEP shall be prohibited from attending or participating in all school-sponsored, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities (including graduation ceremonies, homecoming, prom, dances, and other social activities) in which Lago Vista participates.</p> <p><b>Note 2:</b> Students who are in OSS shall be prohibited from attending or participating in all school-sponsored or extracurricular activities in which Lago Vista participates during the duration of their time in OSS, including all such activities the last day of OSS.</p> <p><b>Note 3:</b> For students placed in DAEP, the curriculum in DAEP will meet the standards set by the state of Texas. Any other curriculum arrangements will be made at the discretion of the teacher and principal.</p> <p><b>Note 4:</b> The campus discipline committee consists of 5 campus employees (3 teachers, one counselor, and one administrator). They must make a decision within 30 school days of receiving a written appeal. There can be one appeal per semester. Three members need to be present for a decision to be rendered. A member of this committee is not personally liable for any act or omission arising out of the duties as a member of the campus discipline committee.</p> <p><b>Note 5:</b> All student code of conduct violations that are violations of the criminal code will be reported to the proper authority.</p> <p><b>Note 6:</b> When a student code of conduct violation can be found under more than one discipline category the most serious category will be considered first.</p>
