# New Medication Permission forms this year

## Please read these very important changes:

- ONLY PARENTS may bring medicine to school (DO NOT SEND WITH CHILD)
- Students can only carry medications if specified as emergency meds by their physician
- Prescription meds must be in the original container and REQUIRE A PHYSICIAN'S SIGNATURE, not just the pharmacy label
- Non-prescription meds (OTC) must also be in the original and unopened container
- OTC meds given for over 5 consecutive days require a written physician's signature

### Lago Vista Independent School District Medication Administration

This form must be fully completed in order for the student to receive the requested medication. A new medication administration form must be completed at the beginning of each year, for each medication and each time there is a change in dosage or time of administration of the medication. ## Getting ready for Sports, Marching Band or Cheer?



All students grades 7 - 12 who participate in UIL Athletics, Marching Band or Cheer must have a physical done before playing. Physicals are required every 2 years. Typically in 7th, 9th and 11th grades.

Band and Cheer students need to turn in their completed physicals to their directors.

- Screens teens, **ages 14-18**, for Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy (HCM). Generally, one screening after age 15 is sufficient, unless cardiac symptoms are present.
- HCM causes a thickening of the heart wall, and can lead to obstruction of blood flow and an erratic heartbeat.
- HCM typically does not present any symptoms.
- ◆ HCM is the leading cause of sudden cardiac death in young people.
- ◆ HCM effects roughly 1 in 500.
