Please let your campus nurse know if your child has had a concussion, either at home or in school activities so we can help them heal safely.

Concussions: True / False

1. Concussions can only happen if you lose consciousness:

• False - Losing concsiousness is only one sign of a brain injury

2. If you see a knot or swelling after hitting your head, it means there is nothing bad happening inside the skull and no worry about a concussion:

• False - Swelling on the outside of the skull does not tell us about conditions on the inside.

3. You can get concussion without actually hitting your head:

• True - Concussions can occur when there is enough force to make the brain "slosh" against the skull, like in a whiplash situation from a car accident.

4. Your child had a CT or MRI scan after the injury and it was normal so there is no concussion.

• False - Scans cannot show a concussion. It is only diagnosed by a physician based on their symptoms.

Safety with Medicine - New forms this year



Please read these very important changes:

- ONLY PARENTS may bring medicine to school (DO NOT SEND WITH CHILD)
- Students can only carry medications if specified as emergency meds by their physician
- Prescription meds must be in the original container and REQUIRE A PHYSICIAN'S SIGNATURE, not just the pharmacy label
- Non-prescription meds (OTC) must also be in the original and

<u>unopened</u> container

• OTC meds given for over 5 consecutive days require a written physician's signature

Just some of the many ways we work to keep our schools safer




Prevention & Response:

- Stay Alert Annonymous Reporting system: a confidential reporting service for students, teachers, staff, parents and community members to report unsafe behaviors, bullying acts of violence, harassment, and any threatening, harmful or unsaafe disruptors to school safety. Available on all the student devices.
- **Raptor Alert**: You are already familiar with signing in and out with Raptor at our campuses but there is much more: <u>https://raptortech.com/raptor-alert/</u>
- Active Monitoring by First Responders: All Lago Vistas ISD two-way radio channels are actively monitored by Travis County ESD #1. The Lago Vista Police Department has secure access to the centralized management system for the Lago Vista ISD security camera system and provides active monitoring of live feeds, as appropriate. The Lago Vista Police Department is also providing increased patrols and campus walkthroughs at each campus in the District.
- Bark for Schools Content Monitoring: Bark for Schools provides Lago Vista ISD with monitoring services to scan emails, chats, and files for signs of serious issues like suicidal ideation, threats of violence, bullying, and more.
